## **For Classes- VI to VIII & IX**

**(i) Unit Test: (25 Marks)**

The School should conduct Unit Test as scheduled during the academic to assess the regular learning outcomes of the students.

**(ii) Periodic Test: (10 Marks)**

The school should conduct periodic written tests in the entire term and the average of the tests will be taken as per the schedule given above.

**(iii) Note book submission (5 Marks):**

Notebook submission as a part of internal assessment is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes for the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep. The parameters are based on regularity in submission of notebook (class work/homework etc), punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

**(iv) Subject enrichment activities (5 Marks):**

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities are to be carried out throughout the term by subject teachers.

**For Languages:** Activities conducted for subject enrichment in languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills. The language teachers may devise their own methods and parameters for assessment of the languages in the area of LSRW.

**For Mathematics:** The listed activities and projects as given in the prescribed textbooks of NCERT.

**For Science/EVS:** The listed practical works/ activities/ may be carried out as given in the prescribed textbook/ curriculum.

**For Social Science/EVS:** Map and project work may be undertaken as prescribed in the textbook.

## **GUIDELINES:**

1. For **Classes-VI to VIII** there will be 2 terms of 100 marks each.
  - 80 Marks for classes VI to VIII (written Exam)
  - 20 Marks for Periodical assessment (10 marks for Periodic Test, 5 marks for notebook submission and 5 marks for subject enrichment).
  - Periodic test 25 Marks: School should conduct 2 periodic tests in a term as per the given schedule and 10 marks weightage will be taken in each term.
  - Unit Test (25MM) should be conducted in the Last week of every scheduled month for the assessment of learning outcomes and remedial measures, the records may be maintained in Teachers Dairy.
2. **Class-IX TO XII:** Exams will be conducted as per **CBSE** norms and guidelines. Refer the latest CBSE notifications and SIE notifications time to time for updates.
3. **Pre Board Examinations** for **Class X and XII** will be conducted as preparatory measures before the Board Exam in the month of January and February or one month prior to the Board Examinations (AISSE & AISSCE) as per the CBSE norms and guidelines by the State Institute of Education.
4. **Centralized Examination for Class IX and XI** will be conducted in the month of March as per the CBSE norms and modalities by the State Institute of Education.
5. All Practical/Project/Internal Assessments for Class IX and XI should be conducted by the concerned Schools in the month of February prior to the Centralized Examination.
6. Annual /2<sup>nd</sup> Term/Yearly Exams for all classes except Board Exam should be conducted in the Month of March and results should be declared on the last working day of March.
7. New session should begin from the 1<sup>st</sup> working day of April 2023. Any deviation for declaration of result and starting of new session must take prior permission, with justification, from the Director of education.
8. The Progress Report format for Class VI to VIII and IX & XI will be shared with all the respective Schools shortly.

## **2.Co- Scholastic activities: ( Class-VI to VIII)**

Schools should promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the student. These activities will be graded on a 3-point scale (A- outstanding, B- Very Good and C- Fair) and will have no descriptive indicators. No up scaling of grades will be done.



## **3. Discipline: (Attendance, Sincerity, Behavior, Values, Tidiness, Respectfulness)**

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character, sincerity, good behavior and values develop strength and foster unity and co-operation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a three-point scale A- outstanding, B- Very Good and C- Fair.

### **Class- XI**

1. The qualifying marks in each subject of external Examination shall be 33%. However a subject involving practical work, a candidate must obtain 33% marks in the theory and 33% marks in the practical separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate, in order to qualify in that subject.
2. No grace marks will be awarded to any student by the Head of the Institution.
3. Eligibility for Compartment in Senior School Certificate Examination: A candidate failing in one of the five subjects of external Examination shall be placed in compartment in that subject provided he/she qualifies in all the subjects of internal assessment. (Chapter-7 Rule 40.2 of CBSE Exam Bye laws-2013)
